The College

The Meston College of Education, founded by early Missionary Pioneers in education in 1937, is governed by the Meston Education and Development Association. The College of Education grew out the Wesley College which was a pioneering arts College for over seventy years from 1861 to 1933. It is affiliated to the TamilNadu Teachers Education University recoginized by NCTE and aided by State Government. The college conducts academic programmes leading to Ph.D., M.Phil.,M.Ed., and B.Ed., degrees participating in welfare and community activities and organizing educational extension work.

Aim of the College

The chief aim of the College is to achieve "Excellence in Education" through various activities fostering professional values and developing learning and research skills among the students and scholars who have a flair for the ideas of education.

The Degree Programme

The Ph.D., degree programme is offered to candidates who are engaged in gainful research so that they can make a superior contribution to the development of educational principles, theoretical and practical.

The M.Phil., degree programme offers opportunity to students pursue research and make in in-depth study of problems in educational areas.

The M.Ed., degree programme is designed to acquaint the students with theoretical and research content and train in research and study skills needed in advanced educational research and creative work. The duration of the course is about one year after the completion of B.Ed., degree programme.

The B.Ed., degree programme combines the practical training with knowledge in theoretical and empirical methods of teaching. The duration of the course is about two years after graduation. Opportunities for observation and practice teaching are provided in the Wesley Higher Secondary School, Emma Foulger School, the practising schools of the College and some other schools in the city.

The medium of instruction in this College is English. The vision of the Founder - Principal, Rev. T.R. Foulger and his pioneering efforts enabled the College to see new milestones and reach post graduate status with M.Ed., degree programme in 1943 with co-operation from various institutions in the city. In 1975 the College was recognized for research leading to Ph.D., degree and in 1991 for M.Phil., course. Thus the College now has four programme of study and research.

Prof. D.T. Chiranjivi who succeeded the Rev. T.R. Foulger and subsequent principals. Prof. R. John Victor, Prof. A.M.Sathya, Dr.L.D. Rabindradas, Dr.G.C. Lionel, Dr.(Miss) Adella Paul and Dr. (Mrs.) Merlyn Sanders were illustrious old students of the College who distinguished themselves as eminent educationists. With the great historical past, the College continues to serve the cause of education by setting up high goals and striving towards them.

The rules and regulations for registering for M.Phil., are given in the regulations of Tamilnadu Teachers Education University..

M.Ed., Degree Programme

Applicant who holds B.Ed., Degree of the TNTEU or an equivalent Degree in education or teaching of other Universities recognized by the TNTEU as equivalent thereto are eligible for the M.Ed. Degree Programme.

B.Ed. Degree Programme

Graduates of the University of Madras are eligible for B.Ed., Degree Programme. Admission of Graduates from other Universities is subject to the approval of the Tamilnadu Teachers Education University.

It highlights all those activities that are being carried out on the campus and outside the campus for the benefit of the student-teachers. It also brings out information related to innovation in the field of teacher education and special education.

Meston Journal of Research in Education

Meston Journal of Research in Education is published once in six months. It is born out of need for a forum, where teachers and teacher educators could exchange their views and findings of their research and innovative practices. It is a collection of research outcomes.

Library

The Library has a vast collection of books and periodicals for B.Ed., M.Ed., M.Phil., and Ph.D. students.

Books may be obtained on loan as follows:

7 books may be taken loan on by each student

Current periodicals are not available for lending.

Books lent may not be retained by students for more than fifteen days, but they may be renewed, if there is no reservation.

Reference books can be borrowed at 4.30 p.m. and returned before 9.15 a.m. the next day, otherwise a fine of five rupees will be levied and no reference books will be issued to the student concerned, until the fine is paid.

A fine of Rs. 1 per day will be levied for each unreturned book.

No marks of any kind should be made in the library books. For books lost or damaged, the student will have to replace the book or pay at least double cost of it.

A student who takes a book himself / herself is responsible for its return and is not permitted to transfer it to another student. The library tickets should be returned at the end of the academic year.

Railway and Bus Concessions

Students who wish to avail Railway concession during terminal holidays, will apply for it in the prescribed form available in the College Office. Students coming from suburban areas will obtain railway and bus seasonal tickets at concessional rate by applying in the prescribed forms.

Certificate

Clearance certificate must be obtained from the library, hostel, office and the optional teachers, in order to get back the college certificates at the end of the year.

Every student will be given a transfer certificate at the end of the course.

Scholarships

Students belonging to Scheduled castes/ Tribes, Backward Class, Most Backward class and the disabled may apply for corresponding scholarships in the prescribed forms at the beginning of the academic year. Loan scholarships are awarded to eligible students by the Government. The scholarship amount includes examination fees, book allowance and a part of the hostel charges.

Meston Men's Hostel and Emma Foulger Women's hostel are functioning in the College campus.

The Mess in which both vegetarian and non vegetarian food is provided, is run by students themselves as a Co-operative endeavour, under the guidance of the wardens.

Hostel Regulations

- 1. Students selected for residence in the Hostel are expected to remain in residence for the period of the College year (excluding the vacation)
- 2. Accommodation cannot ordinarily be provided for guests in the hostel. If in exceptional cases, it is necessary for a member to entertain a guest, the prior permission of the warden must be obtained and guest charges paid at the rates notified by the warden from time to time.
- 3. Hostel mess will function from the re-opening day till the end of the academic year.
- 4. Every inmate is required to have his food in the hostel mess as long as he / she is in the hostel. The student leaving the hostel in the middle of a month will have to pay mess bill for the entire month.
- 5. Mess fees for the whole month has to be paid irrespective of the number of days the student has taken food in the hostel.
- 6. Rebate will not be allowed under any circumstances.
- 7. Hostel mess fees should be paid on or before 10th of every month without fail. A fine of Re. 1 per day will be levied till 20th of the Month. The failure of the inmate to

pay mess fee with fine on or before the date fixed for payment of fees will cause him / her to vacate the hostel.

- 8. The establishment fee once paid will not be refunded.
- 9. The inmates will be held responsible for any damage or disfigurement of hostel property. Any such damage not reported at once to the warden will be charged to the occupants of the room in which it occurs.
- 10. Hostel prayer will be conducted every day in the evenings.
- 11. After 7 p.m. no inmate may go or remain outside the hostel and outsiders are not allowed to remain in the hostel, without the permission of warden. Any breach of this rule will be regarded as a serious offence.
- 12. The College reserves the right of dismissing any member of hostel within twenty four hours notice and will not be responsible for refunding of any fee.
- 13. Students, during their stay in the hostel, will be governed by the management rules.
