### **1. Community-Based Activities**

for example.

- c. Students can clean up open spaces that are home to animals or invite younger students to a meeting and teach them about caring for wildlife.
- d. Planting trees, flowers and community gardens are other ways

### **2. Field Trips**

Exploring the outdoors is an essential part of any nature club, so going on a hike in a state park, taking overnight camping trips or going fishing are all ways to encourage students to get out and enjoy the great outdoors. Before planning a field trip make sure you're following proper protocol.

- a. Nature club members can learn about native plants and animals by visiting local nature preserves.
- b. A visit to a museum or sanctuary that keeps live insects is another way for students to get up close and personal with nature.

### **3. Nature-Based Arts and Crafts**

Nature crafts allow students to explore outside areas around their homes and schools, which can teach them a wealth of information, according to the American Psychological Association.

For example,

- a. Students might learn what types of trees live are them or what kinds of insects, birds and other animals make the areas their homes.
- b. Students can draw pictures of the bugs they see, make collages using nature items they find outside or craft birds' nests with sticks and twigs.
- c. Students can collect wildflowers, press them between two heavy books and then seal the dried flowers between two sheets of contact paper to make nature-themed bookmarks.
- d. Students can take photographs of what they see in nature, download the photos to a computer and create a slide show to share with other club members.

#### **4. Gardening Activities**

Planting a garden teaches students about the life cycle of plants, what plants need to survive and how to tend and cultivate plants to promote growth and production of fruit.

Example:

The club members could also plant a vegetable garden and then donate the produce to a soup kitchen or day care center, or use the produce as they learn to cook.

#### **5. Eco Friendly Campus**

As part of Nature club activity, In our college we has planted many trees and plants every year, more than that 100 plants were planted within the campus.

Routine Campus clearing activity has carried out by the members of Nature Club.

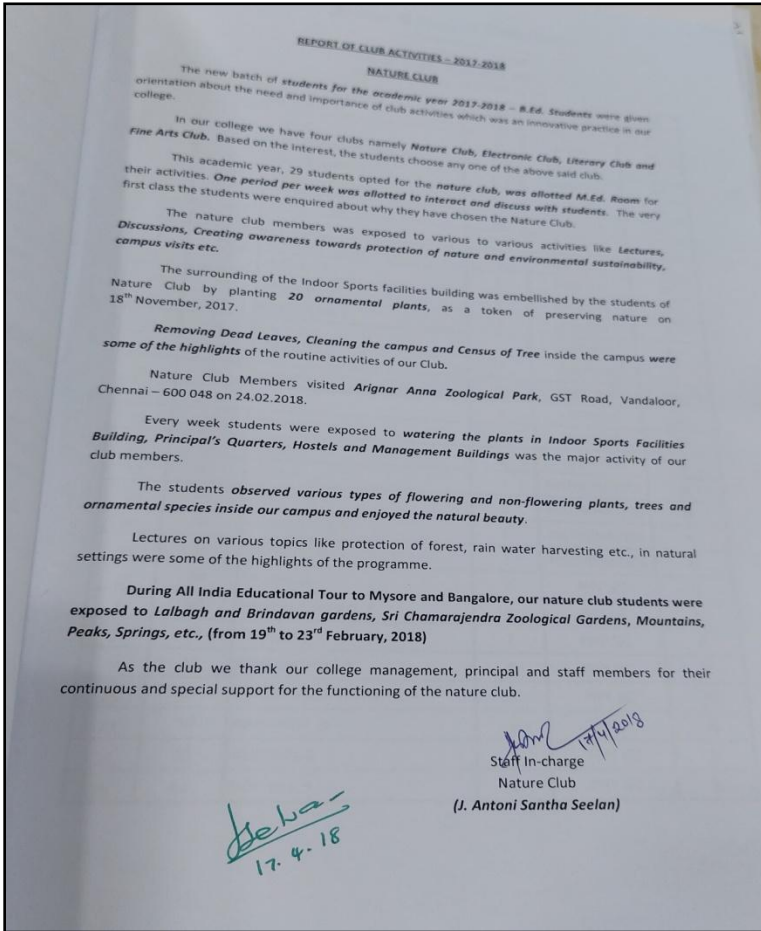
#### **9. Eco-Education International Conference**


The students *observed various types of flowering and non-flowering plants, trees and ornamental species inside our campus and enjoyed the natural beauty.*


Lectures on various topics like protection of forest, rain water harvesting etc., in natural settings were some of the highlights of the programme.

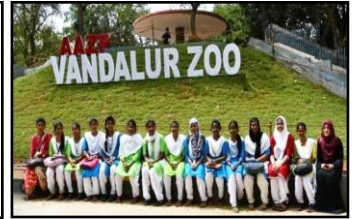

The students observed various types of flowering and non-flowering plants, trees and ornamental species inside our campus and enjoyed the natural beauty.




Our *future project* of our club members is to *take census* about the trees and plants inside our college campus and *put the numbering and name board to each and every tree*.



