REGULATIONS (REVISED)

(with effect from the academic year 2023–2024)

1. **PREAMBLE OF THE PROGRAMME:**

Teacher Education plays a key role in the development of teacher community and a country. To produce a qualified human resource, the academic institutions require adequate resources, competent and committed teachers and properly designed curriculum for every country. The Meston College of Education was established in 1937 and has been producing and supplying trained and qualified Teachers, Teacher Educators, and other Educational Professionals including Curriculum Designers, Education Policy Analysts, Educational Planners, Educational Administrators, Educational Supervisors, School Principals, and Educational Researchers to the country for more than eight decades by offering B.Ed., M.Ed., M.Phil. and Ph.D. Degree Programmes. Our college is the pioneer institution which has the name and fame to be called as the first college established in Tamil Nadu to offer Master of Education programme since 1943.

3. **ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO THE COURSE AND EXAMINATION:**

A candidate shall be admitted to the M.Ed. degree examination, only if he/she submits along with his/her application for examination, satisfactory evidence of having qualified himself/herself for a degree in Education (B.Ed. / B.Sc. B.Ed./ B.A. B.Ed.) from any University accepted by this College as equivalent thereto, in the form of a certificate of equivalence/recognition/eligibility issued by the Tamil Nadu Teachers Education University.

No candidate shall be eligible for acquiring the degree of M.Ed. unless he/she has put in not less than 85% of attendance, completed the prescribed course of study, satisfied the examiners in a thesis on an approved subject and passed the qualifying examination.

Reservation of seats and other concessions for the various communities and other special categories will be in accordance with the statutory provisions of the Government of Tamil Nadu in force from time to time.

4. **DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME**:

The Master's degree in Education (M.Ed.) shall be of two academic years comprising four semesters with 80 credits. Students shall be permitted to complete the programme after fulfilling the requirements of the two-year programme within a maximum period of three years from the date of admission to the programme. The term 'complete the programme' means passing all the prescribed theory and practical examinations of the programme to become eligible for the degree. The number of working days for each semester shall be of 100 (600 Hrs.) inclusive of classroom transaction, practicum, field study, and conduct of examination.

5. **PROGRAMME CONTENT**:

The two-year M.Ed. programme is comprised of six inter-related curricular areas — (i) Perspective Courses, (ii) Tool Courses, (iii) Teacher Education Courses, (iv) Specialization Courses (Elective), (v) Value Added Courses (Elective) and (vi) Internal Courses. All the courses include in-built field based units of study, dissertation and practicum work tailored to suit the requirements of prospective teacher educators. Transaction of the courses shall be done using a variety of approaches, including academic writing, self-development activities, field visits, etc. Weightage of credits for the four semesters during the programme are as follows:

2. **1M-PC –SWA- Social Welfare Activity (Collaborative Work)**

The prospective teacher educator is expected to take part in organizing citizenship training camp for B.Ed. teacher trainees along with the teacher educators. Arrangements of social welfare activities in collaboration with the nearby Village Administrative Officers (VAO) and preparation of Reflective Journal with Photographs, Programmes Schedule, Permission Letter, List of Awareness Programmes, etc." are the required part for this practicum component.

3. **1M-PC- INT: I- Internship: Phase: I**

Phase: I is for a duration of at least 10 working days with 2 credits (1 credit for Three Place visit and 1 credit for Report Writing) during First Semester.

The prospective teacher educator is expected to make a detailed study with photographs regarding organization, objective, organization structure, administration, functions, strengths/weaknesses, output, social obligation, best and innovative practices etc. and to prepare a detailed report not exceeding 40 pages of any three institutions which has educational & social relevance and reputation. Institutions like, DIET, SCERT, NITTER, BRC, TNTEU, IASE, TNOU, NIVH, NIPMED, Reputed social organizations, etc.

Totally 15 working days are allocated for data collection from Schools/ Colleges/ University/Society pertaining to his/her research area. Chapter I, Chapter II, Data Sheet, Master Table and Analysis outputs are to be submitted before the research advisory committee in the Research Colloquium: II.

2) **3M-PC –AW – Academic Writing**

Publication of minimum one research article (Full Paper) related to the dissertation topic of the prospective teacher educators in educational journals and the same need to be appended in the M.Ed. dissertation.

3) 3M-PC – INT: III - Internship: Phase III

In the second semester, Phase III internship is for a duration of 15 working days with 2 credits which involves a compulsory attachment with a teacher education institution. The prospective teacher educator is expected to perform the following assignments during this phase.

- a) Handling of 10 sessions (5 in Perspective Course and 5 in Pedagogical Course or Elective Course) in the B.Ed. Programme, in a teacher education institution under the supervision of a teacher educator by using various methods and technologies. Each prospective teacher educator shall submit their internship reports and Evaluation report duly endorsed by the Mentor as well as by the Head of the Institution, where he/she is attached with and the same is to be submitted to the College.
- b) Preparation and presentation of any two e-content lessons for 5 minutes each.
- c) Organization/ Participation and report presentation on any one co-curricular activity in practicing teacher education college.

The prospective teacher educators have to collect various Advertisements related to Job Opportunities, prepare his/her Curriculum Vitae along with the Covering Letter, show the evidences of Achievements, Reward, Awards, Certificates, Proofs of participation of Non- Scholastic activities and face internal Interview Panel (Mock Interview)

7. **VALUATION OF SUBJECT PAPERS AND THESIS:**

- (a) The subject papers and thesis will be valued by two external examiners.
- (b) If the two external valuations are above the passing minimum and their discrepancy is not more than 15%, the average of the valuations will be the final marks.
- (c) If the two external valuations are above the passing minimum and their discrepancy is more than 15%, the board of examiners will review and award the final marks.
- (d) If the two external valuations are below the passing minimum (regardless of the discrepancy between the two valuations), the average of the two valuations will be the final marks.
- (e) When both the external valuations are below the passing minimum (regardless of the discrepancy between the two valuations), the average of the two valuations will be the final marks.

The College shall conduct a viva-voce for the candidate with the supervisor and an external examiner after the submission of thesis.

8. MARKS QUALIFYING FOR A PASS:

The minimum marks required for a pass in theory courses (or) Practicum component shall be 50% in both internal and external. Candidates who fail to pass in any paper (or) papers shall have to reappear in the concerned paper/papers. Candidates, who secure 60% and above in the aggregate will be declared as passed in FIRST CLASS.

9. **REAPPEARANCE FOR THEORY/DISSERTATION**

Students who have secured 'F' (Fail) / 'Ab' (Absent in the examination) grade in a particular course (other than the practicum components) can reappear during the subsequent end-semester examinations. All applicable fees shall be charged for the purpose of re-appearance in (theory/dissertation) examinations.

10. PROVISION FOR RE-TOTALLING/REVALUATION OF ANSWER SCRIPTS:

Failed candidates who wish to have re-totaling /revaluation of their respective answer scripts can apply within ten days from the date of publication of results. All applicable fees shall be charged for the purpose of Re-totaling/ Revaluation of answer scripts.

11. **PROVISIONS FOR IMPROVEMENT:**

- (i) A candidate who passed in all the courses of a semester may be permitted to improve the results by reappearing for the whole examination of that semester.
- (ii) A candidate is allowed for improvement in aggregate by appearing not more than two times for any semester. Further, aggregate improvement is limited to a period of one year after passing the end semester examinations.
- (iii) A candidate is permitted to apply for improvement of examinations, 30 days in advance of the pertinent semester examination whenever held.
- (iv) If a candidate passes in all the courses in reappearance, higher of the two aggregate marks secured by the candidate shall be awarded for that semester. In case the candidate fails in the reappearance for improvement, the marks secured by the candidate in the first appearance will prevail.
- (v) A candidate who appeared and passed in improvements, is eligible for reclassification of class only and not be considered for ranking purpose.
- (vi) Improvement is applicable only for theory examinations and not applicable for dissertation and practicum components.

12. TRANSITORY REGULATIONS:

Whenever a course or scheme of instruction is changed in a particular year, two more examinations immediately following thereafter shall be conducted according to the old regulations / syllabus. Candidates who failed to appear at the examinations or failing in the examinations shall redo the programme and take the examinations.

13. **GUIDELINES FOR DISSERTATION RELATED WORK**

The M.Ed. students are expected to complete the dissertation work in three phases in four semesters.

Two topics of the dissertation should be submitted to the Research Advisory Committee (RAC), which includes the head of the institution and research Supervisor of the college for approval at the end of the first semester. The dissertation shall be of an educational topic approved by the RAC. If a topic submitted by any student is not approved, he/she shall be permitted to resubmit another set of proposals for scrutiny and approval of the RAC. Each student shall carry out the dissertation related work under the guidance of the allocated faculty member.

After following the guidelines of each semester practical work, the prospective teacher educator has to give a presentation of his/her work in the mock viva, which will enable each student to present their work flawlessly before submission of the dissertation to the examination section for external evaluation. The prospective teacher educators have to complete the data analysis, interpretations and submit three hard copies and two soft copies (CD) of the dissertation along with an abstract before the commencement of the fourth semester theory examinations to the Office of the Controller of Examination with the counter signature of the Principal. Hard copy and soft copy (CD) of the dissertation will be sent for external evaluation and Library. The candidate shall be required to secure at least 50% marks in the external and internal evaluation of dissertation and viva-voce examination separately to pass the examination.

While evaluating the dissertation, the examiner shall either

- i) Award at least 50% marks, or
- ii) Return the dissertation for resubmission with necessary remarks / observations, or
- iii) Reject the dissertation

The candidate, whose dissertation is returned for resubmission may revise the dissertation along with a Certificate of Correction issued by the guide and counter signed by the Principal and re-submit it within a period of two months on the lines of remarks/observations made by the external examiner. Failure to submit the dissertation within the stipulated period, shall result in declaration that the candidate has failed in the M.Ed. examination. A dissertation can be revised only once. If the candidate fails to secure minimum pass mark in the revised dissertation, he/she shall be declared failed in the M.Ed. examination. The external evaluation and the viva-voce shall be done by an examiner.

14. **ELIGIBILITY FOR THE AWARD OF DEGREE:**

A student shall be declared to be eligible for the award of Master Degree in Education (M.Ed.) provided, that the student has successfully completed the course requirements and has passed all the prescribed examinations in all the four semesters within a maximum period of THREE YEARS reckoned from the commencement of first semester to which the candidate was admitted.

15. CLASSIFICATION OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES:

Successful candidates shall be classified separately for (a) the written examination and (b) the practical examination. In each case, successful candidates shall be classified as follows:
